Culture and Society

- Culture ... describes the way of life of us humans with everything that goes with it: education, language, behavior, ethics, science, art, religion, etc
- Society ... describes how people live together, their behavior and how they organize their lives from the family to the form of government
- Culture forms society and mindset!

Three Major Choices

- In OPPOSITION to culture or against culture
- AGREEMENT between Christ and culture
(Christ of culture / assimilation)
- INCORPORATE / TRANSFORM – Christ into culture

Christ in opposition to culture

- Rom 12:2
- 2Cor 6:14-17
- 1Jn 2:15-17
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Christ in opposition to culture

- we must separate us from this world because we belong to Christ
- Loyalty to Christ and the church entails a rejection of culture and society
- Examples:
 - Desert fathers (spirituality out of the wilderness)
 - Monks and monasticism
 - The anabaptist
 - Amish / Bretheren / Hutterites
 - Mennonites
 - Brüdergemeinden / Russland-Deutsche...

AGREEMENT between Christ and culture

- Jn 1:14
- Phil 2:5-7
- Heb 2:17
- 1Cor 9:20-23
- Jer 29:4-7
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AGREEMENT between Christ and culture

- Jesus became fully human and assimilated in the culture – we too have to do so
- To be understood we have to assimilate
- Examples:
 - Ancient Gnostics
 - Kulturprotestantismus / protestant liberalism
 - Jesus People
 - All sorts of celebrities

INCORPORATE / TRANSFORM – Christ into culture

- Gen 12:2-3
- Isa 49:6
- Mt 28:10-20
- Acts 1:8
- Col 3:5-25
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INCORPORATE / TRANSFORM – Christ into culture

- Jesus was completely part of the Jewish society, lived in that culture and still was different
- Jesus also talked to Roman gentiles, a Phoenician woman and so on. But he didn't erase their culture
- Examples:
 - Jesus
 - Acts / Paul / Antioch
 - Daniel
 - Hiberno-Scottish Monks / Mission

The 7 Mountains of culture

- Business / economics
- Politics
- Media
- Entertainment / Art
- Education
- Family
- Religion (or faith)



Combination of perspectives:

1. Learning from Luther:

- i. Realism & Humility: World is fallen, Christians live in the tension between faith and world
- ii. Avoidance of a totalitarian Christianity by separation of Spiritual ministry and secular powers

2. Learning from the Reformed:

- i. Commitment and responsibility: Faith affects all areas of life – including politics, business, culture
- ii. transformation of society out of love for one's neighbor and creation

3. Reflecting with Reinhold Niebuhr:

- I. Conscious choice of posture depending on the context:
 - i. sometimes "against culture" (in case of injustice),
 - ii. sometimes "renewing" (in the field of education),
 - iii. sometimes "in agreement"

CONCLUSION

- Christians live in a tension between
 - adapting,
 - resisting and
 - changing the culture –
- depending on the context!
